1. Setting of the testing and target group

This report presents the results of the 2nd NGEnvironment Partner Meeting (Foster European Active Citizenship and Sustainability Through Ecological Thinking by NGOs, 2018-1-DE02-KA204-005014).

The NGEnvironment Partner Meeting took place between the 22th and 23th of May 2019 in the premises of the Permacultura Cantabria (PC) in Santander in Spain. Moreover, 12 persons evaluated this meeting.

After the 2nd NGEnvironment Partner Meeting, the evaluation questionnaires were handed out to the participants, in order to evaluate and improve the quality of the project. It reflects the personal impressions of the participants about the project.

The results of this questionnaire are the following:

2. Quantitative data

In table 1, we can observe that most of the participants were satisfied in general with the whole 2^{nd} partner meeting, since we cannot find any negative answer regarding this meeting. This is also shown by the results that most participants (75.00%) totally agree that the whole training corresponded to their needs and expectations (see table 1).




Figure 1: Evaluation whole meeting

Furthermore, over 80% totally agree that the meeting objectives were clear (see figure 1). Even so, the item "The level of this meeting was appropriate" were evaluated very positive (75,0% totally agree). Nevertheless, most participants (over 75.00%) think that the meeting contents were presented in an engaging way (see table 1).

Furthermore, the coordination was well prepared and very helpful for the participants. This is also shown by the results which are shown in table 1 (100 % totally agree).

Overall, all participants were happy with the meeting results (see figure 1). Therefore, we can conclude that most of the participants have a clear picture now of the projects' next steps (83.33% totally agree) and know what their tasks for the upcoming period are (83.33% totally agree).

Furthermore, the participants have the opportunity to express their opinions on the basis of open questions. The results of the qualitative data can be seen in the following:

As you can observe in table 2, the majority of participants have no concerns regarding the development process in NGEnvironment and the quality of the management or collaboration of the project. This is also underlined by the quote: "Coordination is just perfect. Documents are coming with enough time and tasks are clearly defined" (see table 2).

Table 3 shows the answers regarding the suggestion for the future cooperation/ communication in the NGEnvironment project. Here, only 7 participants give an answer. Moreover, they indicate that there is a good and clear communication between all partners. Nevertheless, one participant proposes to use the same templates for communication for an organised and well-structured working (see table 3).

What would you like to suggest for the future cooperation/ communication in the NGEnvironment project? (7 answers)

- A permanent observation of the project plan & calendar.
- All partners should respond properly to messages (i. E. in max. 2 days!) and confirm that they got the messages(s) and understood the content of it in terms of tasks/ responsibilities and deadlines...
- I think that the communication between partners is clear and regular. This helps to keep the work as tasks organised and the next-steps are very clear.
- It is very organized, so I have no suggestions
- The coordination was very good
- Nothing important! Communication is working well!
- According to my opinion, all partners should be careful to use the same templates/ Style for communication, e.g. Sinergie used newsletter template on mail chimp as developed by across limits that is completely different from template provided by Gie. We'd need a more coordinated approach

- Newsletter: Word Five proposed by Gie
- Future in perspective would like our logo to be featured on the web site.
